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Collaboration

Google Docs has a word processor, a presentation maker and a spreadsheet application - all created and hosted on the Internet! Share your documents with others, or add collaborators to create a group document. No more e-mailing back and forth!



Use Skype & Elluminate to synchronously connect with people all over the world, or just across town!



Digital Storytelling

Digital Storytelling can be even more compelling using online tools such as Voicethread and Community Walk. Voicethread allows multiple users to comment on a series of images. While Community Walk combines your images with Google Maps to give your stories a geographical context.



Personal Learning Community

Use Aggregators such as Google Reader or netvibes to keep track of all of your favorite blogs. Whenever a new post occurs - it appears in your aggregator!



Social Bookmarking allows you to store your bookmarks online, share them with others, and get recommendations! Set up a group of links for your class to explore, or ask your students to create their own.
